

# A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

I am proud of the steps we have made in 2022. Inspired by SDG 4 on Quality Education, FEDU is an organization that has a mission to provide adequate learning materials to under-resourced people including children, youth, and teachers. This past year, we furthered our partnerships with pre-primary schools in rural Burundi. By contributing financial, material, and professional support, we sustained the education of over thirteen teachers and ninety children of which some of them are orphans.

I am most touched by the football competition we hosted centered on blooddonation awareness through our Fount Tournament program. Many hospitals and emergency clinics in Burundi do not have enough blood reserves to meet patient needs. The tournament managed to draw hundreds of people from Makamba province, and many attendees and sports players pledged to donate blood in response.

We still have a long way to go to meet our big vision, and we have not even scratched the surface yet. We see FEDU as the platform that will begin tackling broken educational systems in underdeveloped communities. Next year, we are looking forward to creating better support systems, to building more partnerships, and to having a greater impact on education overall. This big challenge has created a huge opportunity, and we are excited to take that leap.



#### **FOUNT ACADEMY**

This past year, FEDU focused on educational training for teachers and children through local schools. Through our distribution of learning materials, handson training with those materials, and live classroom practices, we facilitated holistic and quality educational experiences.

## WHAT'S NEW

#### **FOUNT TOURNAMENT**

During the summer, we hosted a football tournament for the first time in Burundi. Over 500+ people were sensitized to the benefits of donating blood to save others' lives. We garnered pledges from attendees to donate blood to support local clinics and hospitals.



#### **FOUNT HUB**

Beginning in September, we began preparing the curriculum for Fount Hub, focusing on building our courses on self-discovery and purpose alignment for the Genesis Phase. We also held professional development sessions to prepare our trainers for the first cohort.


#### **PREPARATION**


